

### **IMPORANT INFORMATION**

These instructions must be read and understood by all operators and strictly adhered to

### Safety Check list prior to use

- Ensure attachment is compatible and fits your materials handler correctly. Check for wear and misalignment on the back plate of your materials handler
- 2. Check hydraulic connections for compatibility and condition. Ensure connections are clean

### **Attaching to Materials Handler**

- 1. Do not, at any time, stand under raised attachment
- 2. Hook up materials handler to attachment fully crowded back
- 3. Extend locking pins either manually or hydraulically to secure attachment to materials handlers. Visually check they are in the correct position. Do not stand under raised attachment
- 4. Stop Engine. Relieve hydraulic pressure and connect hydraulic hoses. Do not stand under raised attachment.
- 5. Restart engine. Operate to full extent of rams. Check visually for leaks. <u>Do not stand under raised attachment</u>. Should a leak be discovered, stop engine and relieve hydraulic pressure. Attachments must not be used if any leaks are detected on hydraulic hoses

### **Headstocks and Adaptor Plates**

1 DO NOT exceed the maximum safe working load (SWL) of the headstock/adaptor plate as listed on the serial plate



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## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

### **Operating Instructions**

- Do not stand on, under of near attachment when it is liable to move or be operated
- 2. On certain machines it may be possible to foul tyres with attachments. To avoid this, the following must be adhered to:A. Operators must familiarise themselves with attachments & their use. B. When operating the vehicle on full lock reverse motion, ensure that attachments do not foul tyres on full tilt
- 3. Only use the attachment for the purpose it was intended for
- 4. In respect of fork and grab attachments, we recommend that these are left in a closed position when not in use and detached from materials handler

### **Routine Maintenance**

- 1. Check hydraulic hoses daily for damage, wear & leaks
- 2. Check all nuts, bolted connections and tines daily for tightness
- 3. All lubrication points must be attended to regularly (weekly at a minimum)
- 4. Replace specific wearable parts (e.g. toe plates) before damage to the main unit occurs
